## TROPICAL STORM SURIGAE

### Highlights

- Ongoing weather updates from NEMO and National Weather Office as of April 15, 2021.
  - o Special Weather Statement, Thursday, April 15, 3PM – UPDATE – Tropical Storm Warning in effect for Kayangel & Koror, 125 miles NE of Kayangel and 175 miles ENE of Koror, windier conditions of up to 40 mph.
  - o Special Weather Statement, Thursday, April 15, 7PM – UPDATE – Tropical Storm Warning remains in effect for both Kayangel & Koror, 110 miles NE of Kayangel and 160 miles NE of Koror, windier conditions of up to 40 mph.
  - o Special Weather Statement, Thursday, April 15, 10PM – UPDATE – Tropical Storm Warning remains in effect for Kayangel & Koror, 90 miles NE of Kayangel and 150 miles NE of Koror, windier conditions of up to 40 mph.
  - o Special Weather Statement, Friday, April 16, 1AM – UPDATE – Tropical Storm Warning remains in effect for Kayangel & Koror, 85 miles NE of Kayangel and 140 miles NNE of Koror, windier conditions of up to 40 - 50 mph.
  - o Special Weather Statement, Friday, April 16, 1AM – UPDATE – Tropical Storm Warning remains in effect for Kayangel & Koror, 85 miles NE of Kayangel and 140 miles NNE of Koror, windier conditions of up to 40 - 50 mph.
- PRCS DM Team briefed all staff at the Headquarters and initiated PRCS Skeleton Team for over night monitoring and surveillance of weather conditions and secure communication lines with state R-DATs at 5PM, April 15.
- Initial tasks were assigned to PRCS unit heads and their assistants in preparation and readiness if weather conditions worsen.
- RDATs were activated to manage the Evacuation Shelters as of 6:35 PM, April 15.
- Koror Elementary School Shelter, Koror was opened and Red Cross a team from the Headquarter was sent to manage the Shelter as of 1:20AM, April 16.

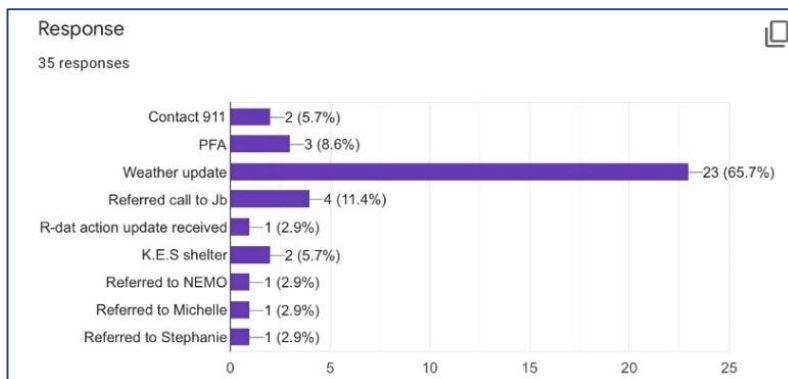
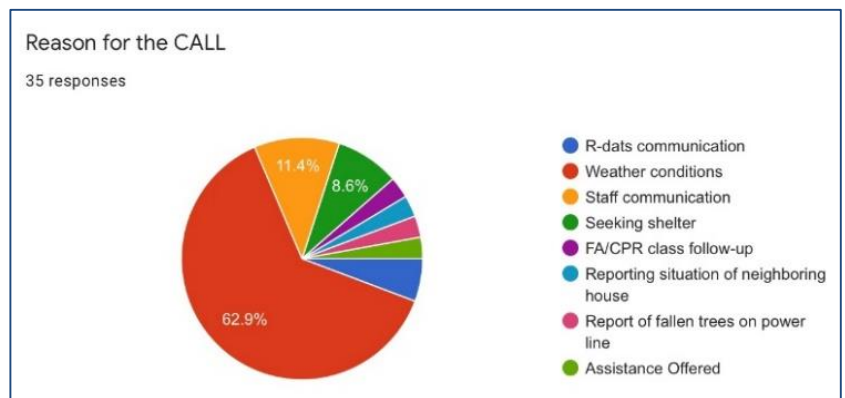
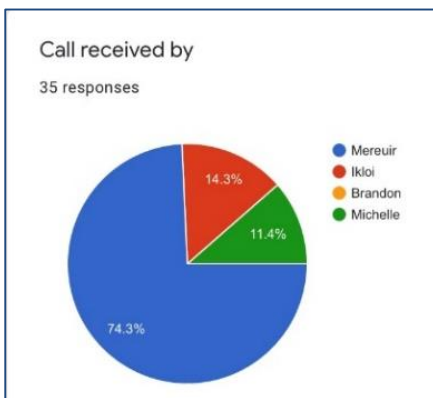

- Evacuation Shelters Management SOP:
  1. GO TO SHELTER – Take Equipment, if any.
  2. Set up Registration Table
    - a. Name
    - b. # of people – Elderlies, Infants, Pregnant, Disabilities, etc.
  3. Allocate space for families within the Shelter
  4. Provide Psychological First Aid
  5. Report to HQ the needs of the people
    - a. Things to look out for:
      - i. Toilet conditions, lighting, supplies
      - ii. Access to water
      - iii. General Areas – lighting, safety
      - iv. Rubbish Collection
      - v. Food
- Walk in assistance request at 12PM, April 16, Male reported 2 households that have been partially damaged. Both households evacuated. Information was shared on the situation. PRCS will call back if situation changes.
