



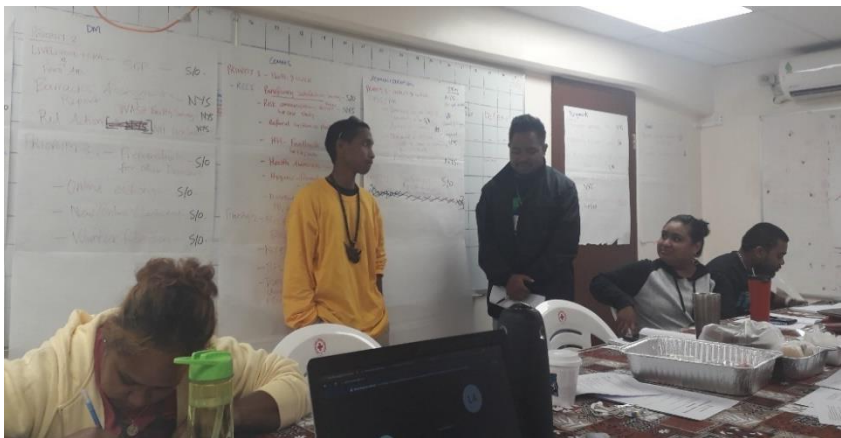
## TYPHOON SURIGAE

### Highlights

- PRCS Staff participated in a Psychological First Aid (PFA) for Disaster Response Training at PRCS EOC.

Ms. Malini Nair, Senior First Aid Country Cluster Delegation for the Pacific, IFRC, lead the two-day training. All PRCS staff who completed the training received their certificates.

Psychological First Aid (PFA) is an initial disaster response intervention used to help people in distress after a difficult situation. The purpose of PFA is to promote safety, calm people, and connect them with assistance and other resources of help.

### Red Cross Response

#### **No. of Personnel Activated (6/11- 18/21)**

- 4 **regular** volunteers (3/F, 1/M) are assisting PRCS staff with Typhoon Surigae work in different departments such as with the support management (Administration and Finance), assisting with procurement, catering, answering phone calls and walk-ins (reception) and other duties as assigned. The PRCS logistics and distribution team, headed by the Incident Commander and Disaster Management Officer are also assisted by volunteers to help move NFIs or do other Typhoon Surigae related work.  
These volunteers have volunteered with PRCS in the past and are familiar with how PRCS does work during EOC.

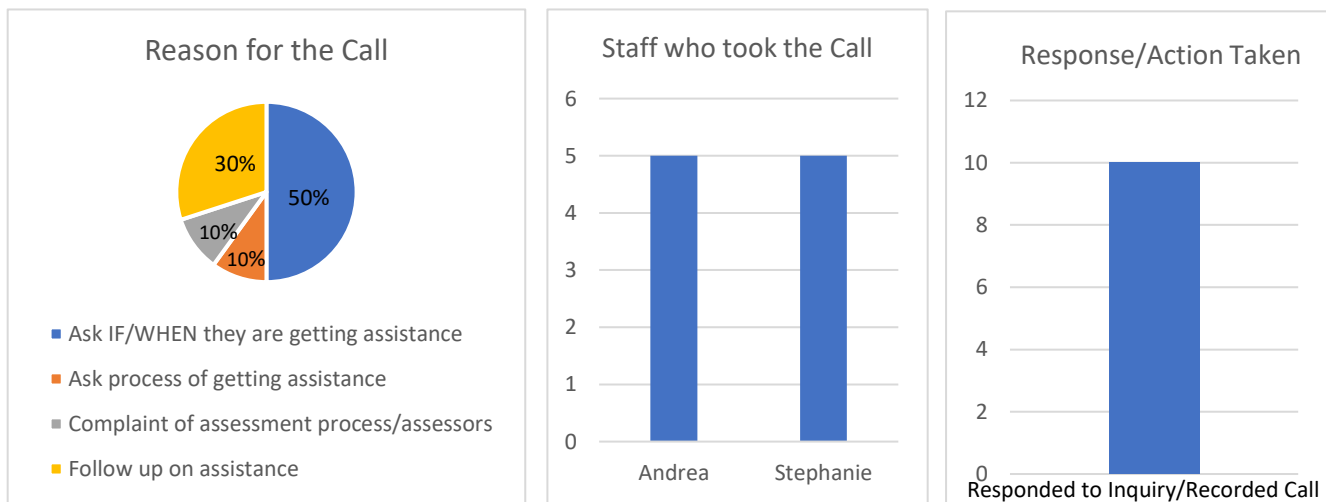
